Mediation Position Statement



Mediation is a voluntary and confidential process where two or more disputing parties work together to resolve their conflict with the assistance of a neutral mediator.

- ▶ This process takes into account the interests and needs of the parties involved, focusing on finding solutions rather than assigning blame.
- Parties will only speak with the mediator on the day.
- ▶ The mediator facilitates the discussion but does not impose a solution, allowing the parties to create their own agreement within the Residential Tenancies Act 2004.
- All participants should engage in mediation with a spirit of compromise, aiming to reach a mutually satisfactory settlement.
